KILLARNEY GOLF & FISHING CLUB TO HOST 2025 EUROPEAN AMATEUR TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

Killarney Golf & Fishing Club will host the six-man team event which sees many of the sport's brightest amateur talents represent their countries.



The par-72 Killeen course, which has hosted the Irish Open six times, will provide the test to Europe's top amateur teams next year.

The golf club, located near the south-west coast of Ireland and adjacent to the picturesque Killarney National Park, will provide the perfect setting for what is one of the most exciting events on the European golfing calendar.

"We are all looking forward to hosting these brilliant championships back in Ireland again in 2025," said Golf Ireland CEO, Mark Kennelly.

"It was great to see two Irish competitors picking up silverware in the senior championships last year and it will be interesting to see how our team can perform in the wonderful surrounds of Killarney."

The '25 European Amateur Team Championship will see 16 qualified

countries battle for the European crown over two rounds of stroke play and three rounds of match play.

The tournament boasts an exceptional list of past participants including the likes of Rory McIlroy, Jon Rahm, Viktor Hovland, Tommy Fleetwood, Ludvig Åberg, Shane Lowry and Justin Rose to name a few.

The event was last played in Ireland in 1997, when current trophy holders, Spain triumphed at Portmarnock. Although 2025 will mark the second time the event has been played at Killarney, 50-years on from when Scotland lifted the trophy at the Irish venue.

The Irish team will look to make the most of home advantage and end a 16-year wait for a gold medal in the tournament. Team Ireland's last European Amateur Team Championship victory came in 2008 at Royal Park I Roveri in Italy which will host this year's event.

"The prospect of witnessing the finest amateur golfers on our home turf is a source of excitement and delight for our members," said Killarney Golf & Fishing Club Captain John O'Mahony.

"We look forward to working closely with everyone involved to make the event a huge success for the club, the historic town of Killarney, and for golf in Ireland.

"We have no doubt that the world-class accommodation, exceptional restaurants, and the famous Irish welcome are perfectly poised to provide an unforgettable experience for participants and spectators alike."



GOLF IRELAND LAUNCHES iGolf

New initiative enables golfers who are not members of golf clubs to obtain an official Handicap Index[®]



Similar initiatives operate in other countries including England, Wales, Scotland and New Zealand. Golf Ireland is delighted to announce the launch of iGolf, a new initiative designed to give independent golfers across Ireland access to an official golf handicap.

Independent golfers is a term used for golfers who play golf but are not currently members of golf clubs. For the first time, non-club members in Ireland can subscribe to iGolf and gain a Handicap Index[®] under the World Handicap SystemTM (WHSTM), for an annual subscription fee of €65 in the Republic of Ireland and £55 in Northern Ireland.

The iGolf platform is an easy-to-use, digital system that enables golfers to track their performance, view their playing record, and maintain a Handicap Index[®]. The subscription also provides access to the Golf Ireland handicapping app, giving subscribers a streamlined experience which is subject to the same handicapping rules as club members under the R&tA/USGA regulations.

Growing Participation in Golf

The introduction of iGolf is a significant step in broadening the reach of the game. While the scheme is exclusive to golfers who are not currently or recently (within the past three years) members of an affiliated golf club, it offers a pathway for independent players to enjoy the benefits of regular play with an official handicap.

Similar schemes launched in other countries—including New Zealand (2018), England, Scotland, and Wales (2021)—have seen significant success in encouraging increased participation and ultimately transitioning many independent golfers into club membership.

Golf Ireland Board Member & Chair of the independent golfer working group Jane Joyce added: "Our objective with iGolf and a range of other Golf Ireland initiatives is clear: to protect club membership, while fostering broader participation across diverse golfer demographics and facilitating, as appropriate, a seamless transition to club membership."

"This initiative is supported by the R&A as a way to grow the sport and bring more players into the game."

Golf Ireland, in line with its strategic plan, committed to evaluating independent golfer schemes from around the world and assessing their suitability for Ireland. A working group was established earlier this year to develop and launch this initiative, and it was announced at the Golf Ireland AGM in March. Since then, Golf Ireland has consulted widely with golf clubs and stakeholders, through webinars and in-person meetings, adapting the scheme based on the feedback.

A Broader Impact on the Golf Community

The iGolf scheme will not only benefit independent golfers but also contribute to the sustainability of clubs. Research from similar schemes has shown that iGolf participants are likely to play more frequently, and a significant number eventually transition to full club membership.

"Following our evaluation of successful independent golfer schemes internationally, we are excited to launch iGolf in Ireland. Independent golfer initiatives in other countries have proven to open up golf to a wider audience and create pathways to membership," said Golf Ireland CEO, Mark Kennelly.

"We believe this will contribute significantly to the growth of golf in Ireland, attracting new players and helping to increase club membership over time."







ANNA ABOM WINS BRIDGESTONE ORDER OF MERIT



The season long battle for the Bridgestone Women's Order of Merit would come down to the last event of the season with Edmondstown's Anna Abom snatching the honour following a strong final performance in Ballybunion.

The Edmondstown golfer had been in fine form all year, finishing inside the top ten in eight of her nine ranking appearances, Abom's victory in the Royal County Down Scratch Cup back in March setting up what would become an incredible 2024 season.

The Irish underage International followed up her opening win with a string of top five performances across April and May including runner-up finishes

at the Woodbrook Women's Scratch Cup, Cork Scratch Cup and a tied third finish at the Ulster Women's Amateur Stroke Play Championship.

The second half of the season would see that form continue as Abom picked up another 385 points in her next three events, a top 20 finish at the Flogas Irish Women's Amateur Open Championship providing her with her biggest point haul of the year (165).

Abom would not have it all her own way however as Lahinch's Aideen Walsh would provide ample opposition throughout the year as both players traded positions at the top of the leaderboard.

Walsh's hat-trick of scratch cup victories in Lahinch, Carlow and Hermitage Golf Club helping push the question of where the Bridgestone Order of Merit crown would reside all the way to the final event of the year, the Ballybunion Ladies Scratch Cup.

Coming into the closing event in Kerry, Walsh had held a 77-point lead over the Edmondstown golfer meaning nothing less than a fifth-place finish would be enough for Abom to take the crown.

With that being the case Abom produced some fantastic golf in Ballybunion, a second-place finish giving her a final 125 points to take the Bridgestone Order of Merit title by just 48. A massive 1163-point total secured across an impressive 2024 season, securing just over 500 points more than she had done the previous year.

Walsh, who had been in top form all year which included the trio of scratch cups alongside four other top ten finishes would once again take the runnerup spot, this time amassing a huge 1115-point total while recently turned professional Annabel Wilson (Castlerock) finished the season in third place on 883 points.

Purcell then left the door open for his closest rivals to close in after dropping two shots on holes 11 and 13. However, the 27-year-old ensured he would clinch the title comfortably as he charged home with three more birdies in his closing four holes for a winning total of 18 under par 266.

"It's an amazing feeling. Getting the first one was special in front of the home crowd. And I couldn't have asked for a better second one with so many people watching in what has been an amazing event," said Purcell, who won his maiden Challenge Tour title at the Black Desert NI Open presented by Tom McKibbin in July.

"It was a nervous start where I just made lots of pars before I got a few birdies towards the end of the front nine. I got a bit slow again on the back nine, made a few mistakes but got myself back in the mindset of making birdies and thankfully a few dropped."

With this win in Hangzhou, Purcell jumped eight places to fourth on the Road to Mallorca Rankings at the time.

"It's nice to win one of the elevated events before the grand finals so that I can go over there and enjoy a little bit more. I'm definitely going to celebrate because these wins don't come around too often''.

The Portmarnock man would go on to claim the sixth DP World Tour card when he tied for 23rd in the Rolex Challenge Tour Grand Final in Mallorca.

Annabel Dimmock completed her comeback from injury as she won her first Ladies European Tour (LET) title in five years after defeating Pauline Roussin-Bouchard in a playoff at the 2024 KPMG Women's Irish Open.

nglish star Annabel Dimmock held a two-shot lead at the 54hole mark and produced a round of 70 (-3) to be in the playoff alongside the Frenchwoman on the O'Meara Course at Carton House.

The duo headed back down to 18 for the playoff and both made pars on the first hole, but on the second hole Roussin-Bouchard took a 3wood off the tee, however, it went left into the deep rough and she had to scramble and ended up making a bogey.

Meanwhile, Dimmock - who has come back from eight months out of the game with a thumb injury - went down the middle of the fairway with her driver and left herself two putts to win as she duly rolled in her two-foot putt to secure her second LET title.

Dimmock got off to a good start on the final day as she made birdies on her first two holes but dropped a shot on the 12th hole.

A birdie on 13 saw her just one shot behind Roussin-Bouchard and she rolled in another birdie on 17 for her round of 70 (-3) and to finish alongside the Frenchwoman on 19-under-par.

She continued: "Today was actually quite tough. I was struggling to get the ball in the hole. I got off to a good start and then I struggled a little bit, it didn't feel quite as good. After shooting seven-under, eight-under, it felt like I was having a chop, but I wasn't.

"Ursula [Wikstrom] was chasing me who was in the group with me today and I looked over at the board at 15. I didn't really all day and then I looked and saw Pauline was doing well. I know she's a great player, I played in the playoff with her in Jabra when I won which was five years ago. That's incredible.

"At the last, Pauline hit it a touch left, and I was thinking just play it safe in the middle of the green and then I got up there and I thought oh my gosh I have such a long putt here. I hit a good putt and playing safe paid off there."

Roussin-Bouchard began the day in outright fifth place and made three birdies on her front nine to move herself up the leaderboard.

The Frenchwoman continued to pepper pins rolling in four birdies in a row on holes 10 thru 13 to put herself in a share of the lead.

Another birdie on 15 put the two-time LET winner into the solo lead but she then three-putted on 16, however, she soon bounced back with a birdie on 17.

The 24-year-old saved par on 18 to card a round of eight-under 65 and seal the clubhouse lead on 19-under-par before losing out in the playoff.

"It was just good golf all around," said Roussin-Bouchard. "I missed a few opportunities, but I made others. It was great."

Finland's Ursula Wikstrom finished her consistent week with another round of 69 (-4) for a total of 18-under-par and to miss out on the playoff by one shot and end the week in third place.

Switzerland's Chiara Tamburlini finished in outright fourth place on 17-under-par after firing a round of 65 (-8) on the final day.

The LET rookie was bogey-free rolling in eight birdies including two in the last two holes to seal her lowest-ever tournament round of eight-under.

Four players finished the week in a share of fifth place with Thailand's Trichat Cheenglab, Hong Kong's Tiffany Chan,



UNITED STATES WINS 2024 SOLHEIM CUP

The United States won the Solheim Cup for the first time in seven years after a closely fought final day singles contest at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club in Gainesville, Virginia.



he matches remained on a knife edge until Lilia Vu made a brilliant birdie on the 18th to earn the half point needed to reach 14 ¹/₂ points and win the Solheim Cup for the United States. The final score was 15 ¹/₂ – 12 ¹/₂ in America's favour as they clinched the cup for the first time since 2017.

At the start of the day, the home side had a fourpoint lead with 10-6 advantage over Europe, but it was the holders who won the singles session. unbelievable. That's what you expect from one of the best players in the world."

European captain Suzann Pettersen commented: "I mean, we gave them a run for their money. I don't think anyone expected us to be here at 2:30 and to still have a chance. It's kind of hard to believe that we actually had a chance with kind of that poor of a start, giving them such a head start. But I had fun today. It's always exciting on a Sunday.

"There were possibilities out there, and several times we thought we could get it done. It came down to a couple of matches. Happy for Stacy, obviously, on home turf, but we'll come back very hungry.

"I've had so much fun with these girls. I've truly enjoyed it. Win or lose – yeah, it's fun to win, a little bit more painful to lose, but at the end of the day we've had a lot of small victories within our team this week. We've had a lot of fun, a lot of good laughs, moments that I will cherish forever. It's been a great ride, and Solheims, they're the best."

Højgaard's third birdie in a row on the 18th meant Mcllroy needed to make an eagle on the same hole to force a play-off and a towering approach from 191 yards gave him a chance from 15 feet, only for the eagle putt to slide just wide.

"It was a hard watch in the end but I had a number today that I was trying to reach, and that was eight (under)," Hojgaard said after securing his fifth DP World Tour title.

"Obviously coming in and finishing on nine was gold and I'm so happy. The game's been trending for a while now and to get this one is massive.

"On 10 I got away with a good lie. Thought I hit a great chip there and maybe would have been five, six feet past, but then there was a flag in the way.

"And on 17 I was a bit worried I could be plugged in the bunker but coming up to an uphill lie in the bunker gave me a little bit more confidence that I could get it up and down. To hole it was key."

Manassero finished third after a closing 69, with England's Daniel Brown fourth on six under after signing for a fine round of 66.

While there was disappointment for Rory McIlroy, no doubt his presence throughout the week delighted the massive crowds in what was a hugely successful AMGEN Irish Open.



crucially bogeyed the 17th and then agonisingly missed an eagle putt on the 18th which would have forced a play-off.

McIlroy then missed from inside 10 feet for birdie on both the eighth and the ninth as Højgaard kickstarted his challenge with an outrageous chip-in for birdie on the 10th.

Rory McIlroy finished the 2024 DP World Tour season in style by winning the DP World Tour Championship as he was crowned Race to Dubai champion for the sixth time.

fter a third placed finish at Abu Dhabi HSBC Championship, only South Africa's Thriston Lawrence could deny McIlroy from claiming his sixth Race to Dubai Rankings in Partnership with Rolex of his career.

Lawrence needed to win and for the World Number Three to finish in 12th or worse for him to overturn McIlroy's huge advantage, but his challenge never materialised as he carded a one-under-par total at Jumeirah Golf Estates.

The Northern Irishman shared the lead after the first and third rounds, and looked in total control when he burst three shots clear thanks to a run of four straight birdies from the second.

Rasmus Højgaard remained in touch and capitalised on bogeys at the ninth and 13th from McIlroy to sit alongside him at the summit at 13 under.

However, birdies at the 16th and 18th paid dividends for McIlroy as he secured his third triumph on the Earth course by two shots to complete a season-finale double.

"It means a lot. I've been through a lot this year, professionally, personally and it feels like a fitting end to 2024," McIlroy said.

"I've persevered a lot this year, had close calls and couldn't get it done. So to be able to get over the line. I'm really pleased with the way I finished and thankfully I hung on on a tough day and got it done.

"It's been a long year, my 27th tournament, which is a lot to me. Looking forward to a little bit of downtime.

"I have a lot of friends and my family here in Dubai so I'm sure we'll have a good night tonight."

The Frenchman slid a putt by at the second which would have improved his score and McIlroy and Højgaard responded by birdieing the same hole to return to 12 under.

McIlroy gained momentum and put his approach inside four feet at the third, which he rolled in to rejoin Rozner at the summit.

The birdie trail continued for the World Number Three at the fourth to become the first player to reach 14 under and when he followed suit at the fifth, he was two clear.

Antoine Rozner, who shared the third-round lead with McIlroy and Højgaard, birdied the opening hole to take the outright lead at 13 under, which turned into a two-shot advantage after the final group bogeyed the same hole.



Before McIlroy teed off at the sixth, Rozner bogeyed the same hole to inflate the Northern Irishman's advantage to three.

Rozner and Højgaard replied with a birdie at the next, however, Mcllroy continued to keep his nose out in front despite a bogey to close his front nine.

It became a two-way tussle with Højgaard following his birdie at the seventh, while Rozner slipped back after a double bogey at the ninth.

McIlroy narrowly missed chances to extend his lead at the start of his back nine and when he bogeyed the 13th, there was a two at the top.

The 35-year-old showed his quality at the 16th by landing his approach inside a foot for his first birdie in 11 holes, which Højgaard could not match.

The Dane drained a clutch par putt at the 17th to remain one behind going down the last as the leader narrowly missed his birdie effort.

Neither player found the green in two and Højgaard could not hole his birdie effort to extend the season. That gave McIlroy two putts for victory as he finished with a closing birdie and total of 15 under.

Former World Number One Adam Scott and Ireland's Shane Lowry carded final round 68s to finish in a tie for third at 11 under alongside Rozner, who birdied the last to earn a PGA TOUR card for next season.

Englishman Tyrrell Hatton was one shot further back in solo sixth, while Scot Robert MacIntyre wrapped up the top ten alongside Chilean Joaquin Niemann, Japan's Keita Nakajima and Swede Jesper Svensson at nine under.





MONTADO HOTEL & GOLF RESORT

The Golf Course of Montado can be found near the Castle of Palmela, surrounded by vineyards developed in a harmonious whole of Cork Trees, where streams and lakes make the magical beauty of this golf course. It has been carefully inserted into a landscape that helps to break the routine of daily life, and is well known for its hole 18 and green located on an island. It is just 30 minutes south of Lisbon, one of Europe's most stylish and historic capitals. After an extensive course refurbishment in 2006, Montado Hotel & Golf Resort was catapulted into the spotlight. The layout is now considered to be one of the best around Lisbon. The course is surrounded by a series of enchanting vineyards, offering a number of memorable holes as you are led to the epic 18th, where a daunting island green awaits.

QUINTA DO PERÚ & COUNTRY CLUB

With the Arrábida mountains as its backdrop, the Quinta do Perú golf course offers amateurs a pleasant game, whilst also presenting a challenge for professionals. It was voted amongst the top 10 courses in Portugal in the biennial poll organised by the European Golf magazine. With its many trees and wild flowers, the course provides a varied start, for the first three holes consist of a par 5, a 386-metre par 4 and a 186-metre par 3. Amongst the first nine holes, attention is drawn to the short eighth hole, with a lake in front of

its green. The next nine holes are even more difficult. Number 12 is a par 4 which, although not very long, has a lake running beside the fairway and down to the green. Then comes what is probably the most difficult test on the course: hole 16, a 200-metre par 3, where one needs to play over a lake to reach the green. The course's recognised quality has led to its hosting several events from the European Challenge Tour.

PGA AROEIRA LISBOA

Located in a protected pine woodland, 30 minutes from central Lisbon, south of river Tagus and near to the beach. Aroeira's mild climate allows golf to be played all year long. PGA Aroeira 1 was designed by Architect Frank Pennink in 1973 with a beautiful tree-lined course adorned by 5 lakes. The course is 6044 meters long and a par 72.

Apart from the quality of two 18 holes championship golf courses, Aroeira offers self catering apartments for rent, a tropical swimming pool, tennis courts and a shopping area with restaurant, supermarket among other shops.

SANTO ESTÊVÃO GOLFE

Designed by the renowned English architect Donald Steel, with a curriculum of hundreds of golf courses around the world, the Santo Estêvão Golfe represents the typical concept of the English school, taking advantage of all the features of the land, respecting and benefiting the existing landscape. This scenery is complemented by areas of natural vegetation, with the golden tones of dry herbs to contrast with the varied colours of spring flowers. An environment that enriches the Vila Nova project of Santo Estêvão making it an epitome of quality and lifestyle.

RIBAGOLFE I & II

Just you and the golf course. The Perfect Partnership on a par with the best in Europe in terms of layout, environmental features and design. It is the creation of the two golf architects Michael King and Peter Townsend, from European Golf Design, an associate of the PGA European Tour. Golf occupies only one third of the total area of the Herdade da Vargem Fresca. There are two golf courses, Ribagolfe I and Ribagolfe II, both par 72 with 18 holes. There is also a vast practice area in addition to the driving range, including chipping and putting greens, practice bunkers and a fully equipped Clubhouse with a proshop and restaurant services. Ribagolfe is on the list of candidates to host national and European competitions. the course is a pleasure to play, whatever one's handicap level. It demands both skill and tactical play, and is acknowledged both locally and internationally as one of Portugal's best constructed layouts. It has in operation an Environmental Management System (EMS) that enables its staff to monitor all matters relating to the environment. The EMS holds an ISO 14001 certification, and is also certified to the European "Committed to Green" Programme.

ESTORIL GOLF COURSE

One of Portugal's oldest and most emblematic courses, the Estoril Golf Course, is located in the residential area of Estoril, only 1 km from the Hotel Palácio, the beach of Estoril and the famous Casino.

The Portuguese Open was played 20 times, Ladies Open and 63 times the Portuguese International Championship Amateur.

OITAVOS DUNES - NATURAL LINKS GOLF

Oitavos Golfe lies within the Sintra-Cascais Natural Park. It is set among pine woods and reforested dunes, in an area of great natural beauty. Being a seaside golf course, the ocean view is present all the time. The layout has been carefully crafted by one of the greatest golf architects of our times, Arthur Hills. Hills has maintained and preserved the unique characteristics of the land, creating a 6.303 metre, par 71 golf course. The environmental certification was done in cooperation with Audubon International, an American environmental association. The sustainability of the resources is the prior objective. The flora and fauna peculiar to the region are strictly protected, with some areas being closed to people and machines. Quinta da Marinha Oitavos Golfe is the 1st Golf Course in Europe and the 2nd in the World being recognized as a Certified Signature Sanctuary – Gold. It is already set as one of the best golf courses in Europe, where a non stress round of golf can be played all year round.

PESTANA BELOURA GOLF RESORT

The verdant foothills of the Sintra Mountains offer a breathtaking backdrop for the Pestana Beloura Golf Course. Here the famous American golf course architect Rocky Roquemore has conceived a course that will stretch both your imagination and ability yet provide an enjoyable challenge to golfers of all levels. 

In this edition of Irish Golf Review, we explore a selection of great options throughout the regions of Scotland for 2025.

SOUTH EAST

East Lothian is known as Scotland's Golf Coast and is blessed with the highest concentration of links courses in the world, with a superb collection of coastal courses stretching from Musselburgh to Dunbar.

Gullane and Muirfield are perhaps the best–known of the courses in the area but elsewhere there is golfing gold to be found. Among the courses, Longniddry stands out for its mix of links and parkland, while Craigielaw is East Lothian's newest course and meets the challenging standards of its neighbours.

Kilspindie is Scotland's 35th oldest golf club, with this medium length course offering a good test of golf and a challenge to all golfers. Several holes border the shoreline and each hole enjoys magnificent views.

North Berwick is one of the most scenic, and wellknown links courses in Scotland with views over the Isle of May, the islands of Fidra and Craigleith, the Bass Rock and across the Forth to Fife. The course is often ranked in the top echelons of course rankings by those in the know and is regarded by many as the best value course in the UK.

Heading south to The Borders sees a change of landscape but no let up in the quality of golf on offer. The only coastal course in the Borders, Eyemouth, boasts one hole actually played across the North Sea, the par 3, sixth, which was recently voted number 1 in Britain's 'most extraordinary golf holes'.

Only 15 miles away is Duns Golf Club, with the Wellrig burn running through the course. Roxburghe Golf Course has the River Teviot flowing next to a couple of holes, as well as the 'Viaduct' 14th, one of the most photographed holes in golf.

St Boswells Golf Course is a 9 hole course set along the banks of the River Tweed, situated next to the Dryburgh Abbey, dating back to 1150. Macdonald Cardrona Hotel, Golf and Country Club is the newest addition to the area and is a combination of a parkland and woodland course and runs along the banks of the River Tweed.

HIGHLAND & ISLANDS

The Highlands has enjoyed being the main focus of attention in recent years thanks to Castle Stuart Golf Course near Inverness, playing host to the Aberdeen Asset Management Scottish Open in recent years. Indeed, the addition of Castle Stuart, regarded as one of the world's finest new courses, has provided a significant boost to a region which was already able to count Royal Dornoch and Nairn among its golfing gems. Alongside Castle Stuart, these three represent some of the best courses not just in Scotland, but anywhere in the world.

But away from the Highlands' Great Triumvirate there is plenty to get the hearts of even the most travelled golfing aficionados pumping. Boat of Garten, near Aviemore has been described by some as the most scenic course on the planet. The Boat is a James Braid creation and his mark can be seen on many more courses across the region including Fortrose & Rosemarkie, Golspie and Brora.

East of Inverness on the Moray coast lies special courses at Lossiemouth, Cullen and Hopeman. Then you have golf on Scotland's islands, which is a truly unique experience. Golf enthusiasts across the globe regularly make the pilgrimage to Askernish on South Uist to experience an Old Tom Morris creation that has recently been restored to its former glory and what many describe as the most natural course in the world.

Elsewhere at Harris GC they still play for the Faldo Fiver, which the six-time Major signed and left in the honesty box after a visit, while the Orkney and Shetland Islands are home to nine courses, including the most northerly course on the British Isles at Whalsey.

SOUTHWEST

As well as being home to a world–class stretch of links golf down its coast, Ayrshire can also lay claim to something nowhere else in the world can – being the birthplace of The Open Championship. Prestwick was the venue for the first 12 Open Championships and to this day retains that prestige and aura that only the most historic of courses can possess.

A warm welcome awaits you at Prestwick St Nicholas Golf Club, a traditional Scottish links golf course which was established in 1851 and occupying a prime position on the shores of the Firth of Clyde on Scotland's west coast.

The course and Club are steeped in history – indeed one of its founder members was Old Tom Morris who was based in Prestwick prior to returning east to St Andrews and his place in golfing legend. It is joined on the coast by Open venues at Turnberry and Royal Troon, both of which offer terrific views and incredible golf architecture associated with the best links courses in Scotland.

But the top–class links golf doesn't stop there – you can add Dundonald Links, Kilmarnock Barassie and Western Gailes to the list of must–play courses on one of the best stretches of golf in Scotland.

Further south lies Dumfries and Galloway, a region full of great value and where you are always assured of a great welcome. Portpatrick, Dumfries & County lying in wait along the coast for those willing to drag themselves south of St Andrews. North of Fife lies Dundee and Angus – commonly known as Carnoustie Country after the famed Open Championship venue. But while the area may be dominated by Carnoustie, courses such as Montrose, Downfield and Letham Grange continue to capture the imagination of visiting golfers. Heading further inland you'll find yourself in Perthshire, known as the gateway to the Highlands and proof that golf in Scotland is about more than links courses.

The most famous venue in Perthshire is undoubtedly Gleneagles, home of three stunning courses as well as the 2014 Ryder Cup venue. The Kings and Queens courses at Gleneagles are both James Braid layouts and are regarded as among the best inland courses in the UK thanks to the crisp turf and imaginative layouts, while the PGA Centenary is a more modern creation by Jack Nicklaus. Elsewhere in Perthshire sits Blairgowrie also Murrayshall, King James VI, Crieff, Pitlochry and many more courses that mean the region can comfortably cater for the many golfing tourists arriving on the back of the Ryder Cup.

and Southerness are some of the more popular courses in this region but there are many more waiting to welcome you should you want to veer from the most commonly beaten track.

Island golf in Scotland is not the sole preserve of the Outer Hebrides. The South West is home to terrific golf on Islay where The Machrie is flanked by no fewer than eight distilleries while Arran can boast six courses, including Shiskine a dramatic and unique 12– hole layout.

Although not technically an island, the Mull of Kintyre can be tricky to get to but the two magnificent courses at Machrihanish and Machrihanish Dunes make any journey worthwhile.

The Gailes Golf Experience which includes three wonderful courses at Dundonald Links, Glasgow Gailes Links and Western Gailes where you will enjoy undulating fairways, tight lies, beautifully crafted greens and renowned West Coast Scenery. You can look forward to playing golf in some of the most iconic stretches of golf links in the world.

HEARTLANDS

There is no doubt that St Andrews will command the attention of any golfing enthusiast and in the words of former Ryder Cup captain Paul McGinley, "every golfer should have at least one visit to St Andrews in their lifetime."

Being home to The Old Course, officially the oldest course in the world, as well as 10 other courses in the immediate vicinity means it is always at the top of every golfer's bucket list. But in Scotland's Heartlands a golfer is spoilt for choice for great places to play the game.

In Fife alone there are more than 50 courses with delights such as Crail, Elie, Lundin Links and Aberdour

CENTRAL

Central Scotland encapsulates a vast area, and one that is home to more than 120 golf courses. You will find the majority are extremely welcome members courses where those living in Scotland's central belt get their regular golfing fix. Encompassing Glasgow, Stirling, Loch Lomond, Lanarkshire, Dunbartonshire, Falkirk and Clackmannanshire, the central region is home to a mix of landscapes and courses. The Carrick, on the shores of Loch Lomond provides world–class views and a real mix of highland and lowland golf. Closer to Glasgow, Haggs Castle is a former host of the Glasgow Open while Lanark, Bishopbriggs, Cawder and Clober are all worth a visit for a friendly welcome and a great round of golf.


